and even sculptures.**



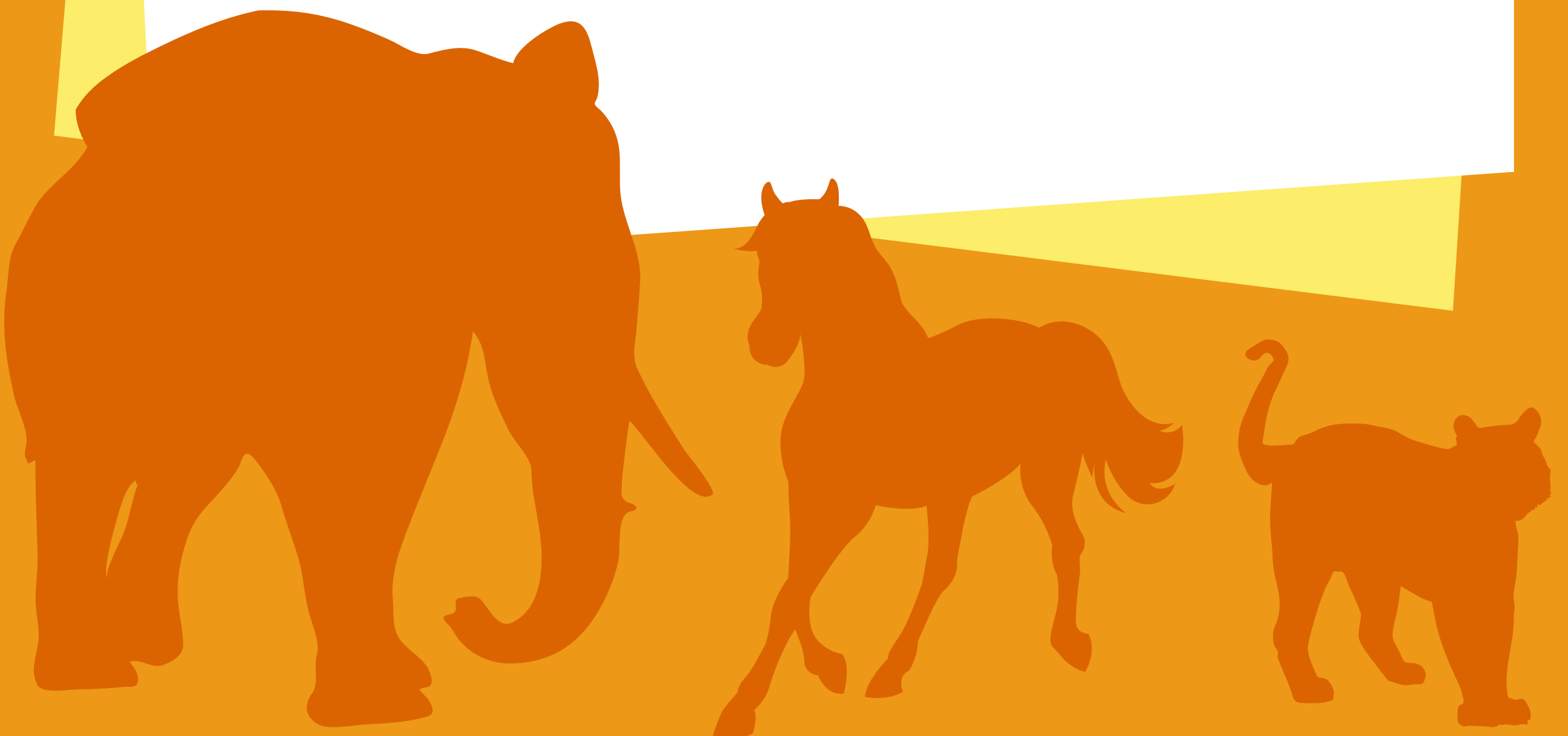


## **Giorgio de Chirico**

## the horse!

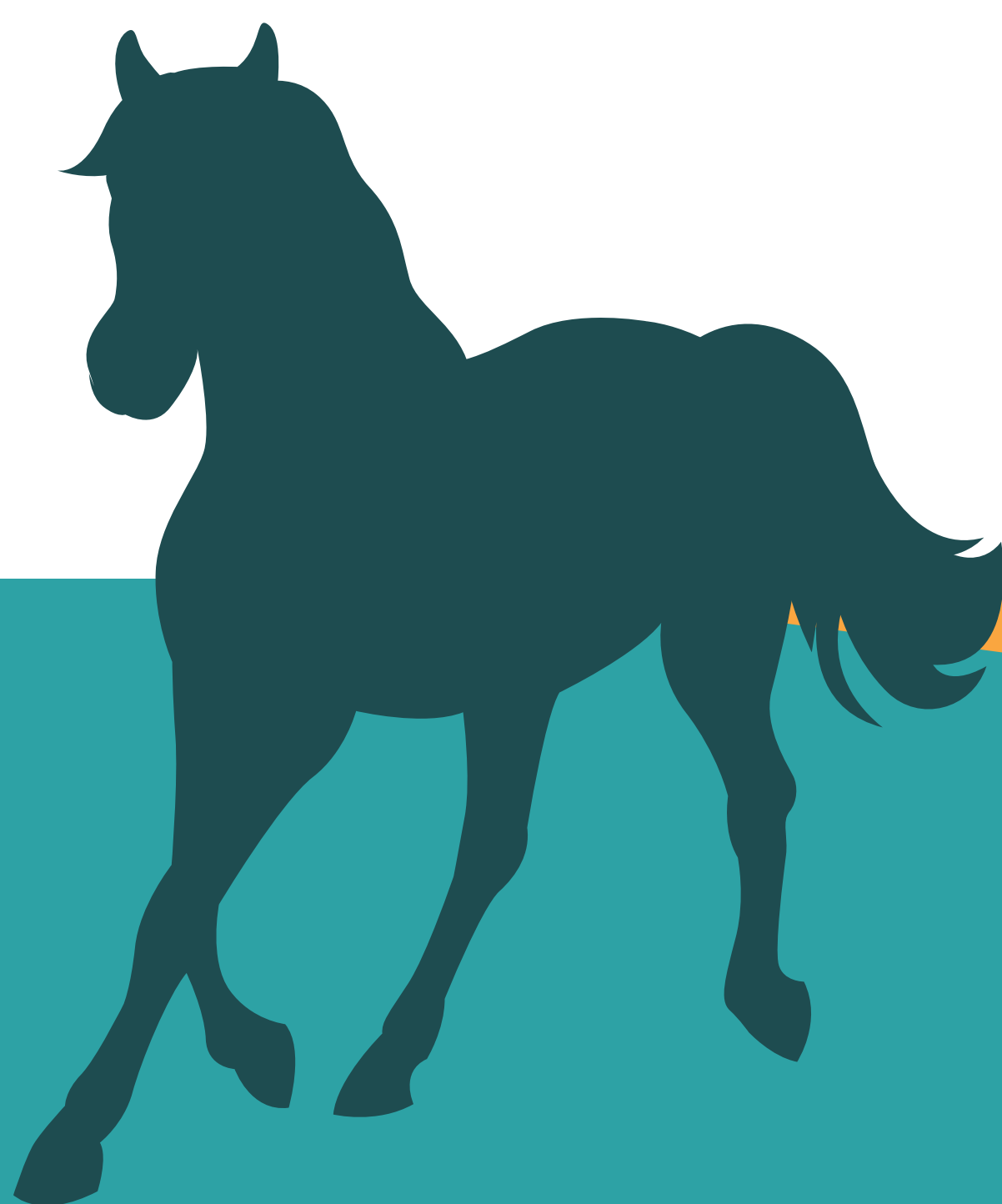
de Chirico often told that the first drawing he ever showed in public was a picture of a horse.

.....

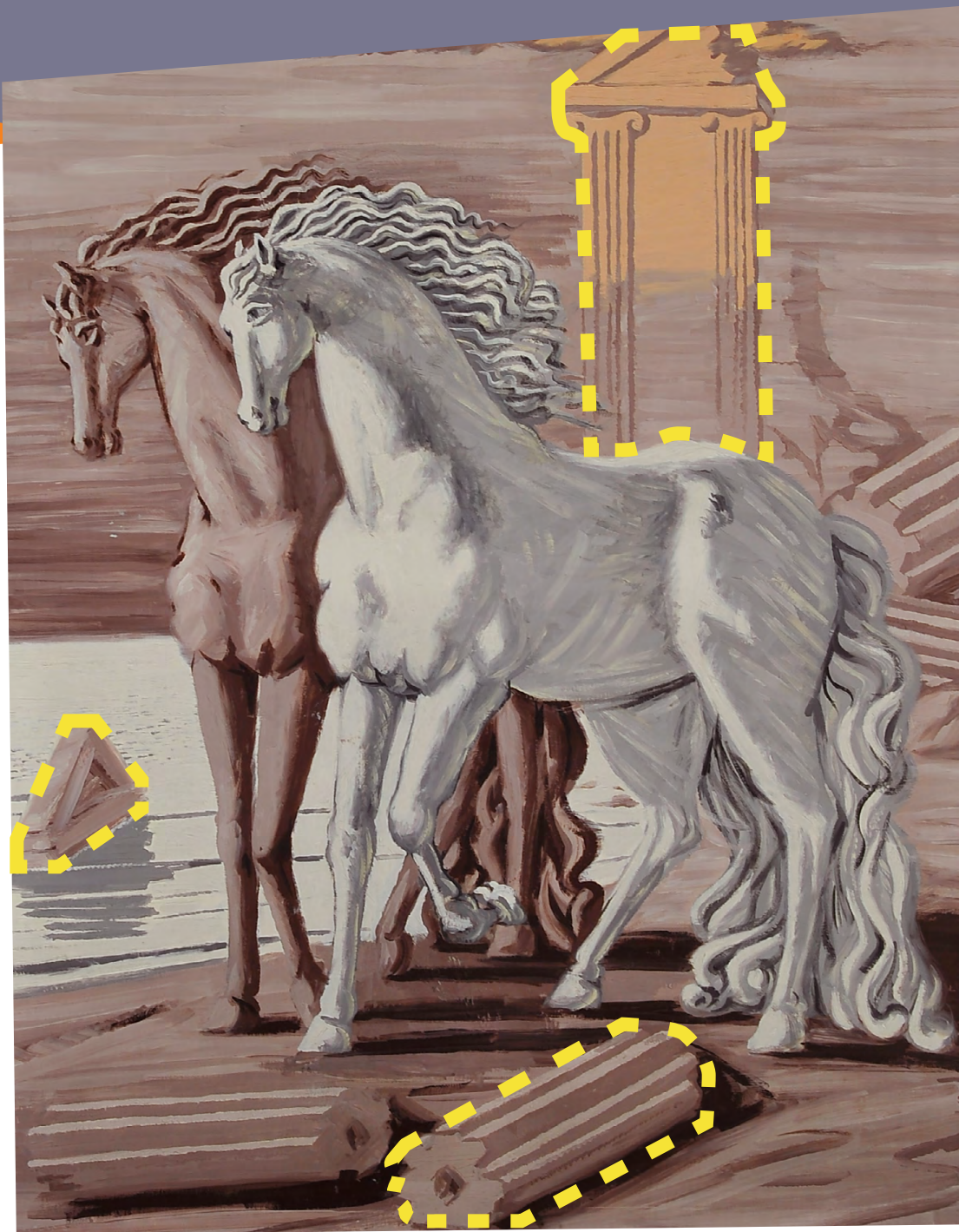
and the other
