a little bit of artistic magic?**



**Look carefully at the artworks,

the **Bilotti family**.

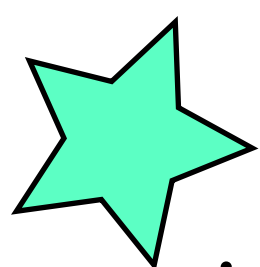


Let's find out more about them together!

CARLO BETTER?**

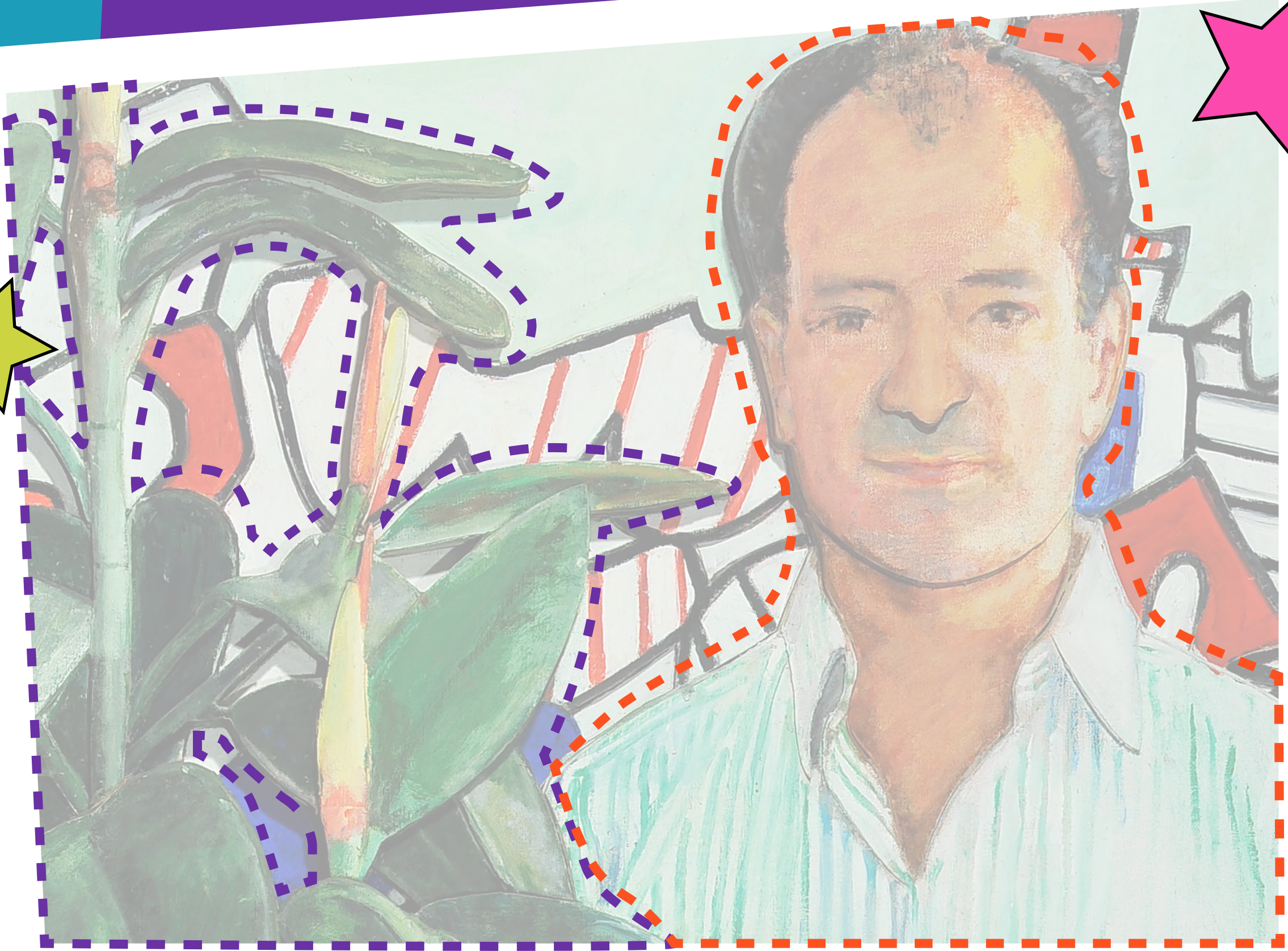


Take a look at the portrait
